New Ventura Art Scene

The Museum of Ventura County first opened in 1913 in the newly built Ventura County Courthouse (now Ventura City Hall). Soon known as the Pioneer Museum, its collections of artifacts and curios were the legacy of Dr. Cephas Bard, a Pennsylvania doctor who came to Ventura after the Civil War. A compassionate man with wide-ranging interests, Dr. Bard accepted historical objects in lieu of cash payment for his services. Priceless Chumash, Spanish and Mexican-American objects from his collection are on display in the galleries today.

In 1977, the Museum moved to its 15,000 square foot building on Ventura's Main Street, near historic Mission San Buenaventura. In 1978, it became an independent non-profit, no longer receiving operating support from the County of Ventura. The Museum of Ventura County has recently undergone a complete renovation and if you haven't been there lately, you haven't been there!

A docent-led tour will be followed by a delicious lunch at a beautiful hill-top home nearby.

Gilded Age to Broadway Stage

“From the Gilded Age to the Broadway Stage” is a short (40 minute) mini musical presented by the Channel Islands Maritime Museum. Listen in as actors portraying Nadia Boulanger (first woman conductor) and Carrie Jacobs-Bond (first woman to sell one million copies of a hit song) have a mythical conversation about popular music from the 1890’s to the 1950’s, sharing juicy anecdotes, humor, and songs by composers such as Scott Joplin, the Gershwins, and Cole Porter. After the performance, we’ll enjoy a gourmet boxed lunch overlooking the harbor and guests can wander throughout this outstanding museum.

Located in the beautiful Channel Islands Harbor in Oxnard, the Channel Islands Maritime Museum permanent exhibits include a seascape gallery of rare and beautiful maritime paintings dating back to the 1600’s and more than sixty world-class models of historic ships.
